

all the way to

Super Cool Trick!

use the natural curving

action that your wrist

makes to get a nice round 'C'

a. the number 2 shape creates the shoulder and the first part of the foreleg

c. drawing the elbow looks a lot like a curvy letter 'L'

d. notice how the forelegs get narrower as they reach the hooves

b. drawing tall 'U'

shapes creates the canon bones
